Protect your business from burglary

- Stay Connected to Your Security System -Use a security system that connects to your mobile device. Not only will it notify you when your business' security system has been armed or disarmed, but it can also alert you to a panic alarm activation.
 Some security systems allow you to arm or disarm your security from a mobile app as well. And, you'll be able to monitor your cameras, as well.
- Lock Up Secure Windows and Doors It may seem obvious, but it's easy for staff members to forget to lock up when they leave the business after a long day. You might consider a selflocking deadbolt. Doors and windows should not only be locked securely with deadbolts and other safety solutions, but you should make sure that they're constructed using high-quality materials too. Heavy metal grates might be necessary for vulnerable windows, and special solutions may be needed for sliding or glass doors.
